### **INCLUSION SUPPORT**

Our vision 'Enjoy, Aspire, Achieve' applies to every student who attends DBS Emirates Hills.

Since our establishment, we have prided ourselves on being an inclusive school supporting a diverse range of pupil needs. We are proud to have a strong inclusion team of Teachers and Learning Assistants, with a wide range of expertise, skills and qualifications to ensure that every student's needs can be identified swiftly and supported appropriately.

Early intervention is a key factor in determining student success. This, alongside strong parent partnerships, are essential components our support of strategy. Therefore, If you have a concern regarding your child's learning please do speak to your child's teacher in the first instance. Our staff will be able to best advise you on how to take your concern forward. Equally if our staff have any concerns about your child they will raise them directly with you before proceeding with any intervention.

Where students do need an additional layer of support, we ensure that parents' queries and concerns about their child's development are discussed openly and thoroughly before putting a support plan in place. Once these conversations have happened together, the school and parents collaborate to devise a personalised educational plan for their child, which meets both the child's academic and pastoral needs. The nature and level of the support we offer depends on the needs of your child and can be short or long term, individual or group, within the classroom or outside of the classroom. We tailor support for every child differently. Rigorous monitoring procedures around every intervention ensure that however we are supporting your child, we know that it is making an impact. Additionally, the traditional curriculum is not always suited to all. Consequently we can also offer bespoke curriculum pathways to meet every student's needs.

If more specialised intervention is required we liaise closely with outside agencies including educational psychologists, occupational therapists and speech therapists. These agencies work in partnership with both the teachers and parents, offering advice and guidance on adaptations that may be required.

We are commited to nurturing every pupil and empowering successful, well rounded individuals, equipping them with the skills essential for life-long learning.

Preparing Your Child For School

Starting school will create mixed emotions for you and your child. You will all be excited to start this important new chapter but it is also natural to feel anxious about what is to come. We hope this section will help you to use the time before school starts to prepare for a smooth transition. If you have support at home with a nanny or maid, please also share this information with them.

All FS1 children must be toilet trained before they commence at DBSEH, including telling an adult when they need to go, wiping themselves and dressing afterwards. For R3 children, we will support them with toileting but please encourage your child to say 'I need to go to the toilet' to convey when they need to use the toilet.

In addition to this, if your child is independent in the following ways, they will feel more confident with life in school:

Encourage your child to dress and undress themselves. FS students will need to do this for swimming lessons. Over the holidays, let your child practise doing up buttons, putting on their socks, zipping up their shorts, putting their shirt on and taking it off. This will help them to feel confident about doing the same in class.

Allow your child to put their own shoes and socks on. This is an important skill for children's independence when playing in the sand pit and water areas. Children can quickly become frustrated and can occasionally forget which shoes are theirs. Please let your children practise this important skill and let them wear their shoes prior to starting school so that they can become familiar with them. Additionally, please ensure all shoes and socks are clearly labelled with your child's name.



If you are teaching your child to recognise/write their name, please use lower case letters with only one capital letter at the start. If you are labelling things with their name please also make sure it is written in this way.

Encourage your child to ask for help when they need it. Reinforce using good manners with "*please*" and "*thank you*".

Please encourage your child to follow simple instructions, such as "*Please get your lunch box*". Pack your child's lunch and then encourage them to get it out themselves and open it up and eat the food independently. This gives you a good idea of how they are likely to manage their belongings at school, as well as recognise which lunch box is their own.

Ready ... Set ... Go!

For our youngest students in Rising 3's and FS1, we tailor the beginning of the term quite carefully to facilitate a smooth and successful start, ensuring that our youngest learners feel happy and confident coming to school for the rest of the year. The following dates are for our **Rising 3 and Foundation Stage 1 students only.** (FS2 to Year 13 timings are shared in their respective Parent Handbooks).

### **MONDAY 25TH AUGUST**

We are planning an OPEN MORNING for families on the first day of the new academic year. Uniform is required.

### **TUESDAY 26TH AUGUST 2025**

Meet the Teacher Appointment will be emailed in late August for your child's class allocation and the timing for the appointment. This will take place online.

### WEDNESDAY 27TH AUGUST- FRIDAY 29TH AUGUST

Cosy sessions – your child will attend one of two smaller group sessions to help settle into the new routines and surroundings. Uniform required.

- 1st Session: 8.00 to 9:45 am. (for siblings and staff children). Water bottles required
- 2nd Session: 10.15 to 12.00 pm. (for all other new children). Water bottles required

Drop Off and Pick Up

### **DROP OFF ROUTINES**

The doors to the Rising 3's and Foundation 1 Classrooms will open at 7.40am. Registers will be completed at 8.00am.

### START OF THE DAY

At the start of the school year the drop off time is flexible (between 7.40am and 8.00am) to allow the children to settle into the routine of school life more easily. The gates are locked at 8.00am and the registers will be filled in. If you arrive after 8.00am, please come into school via the Reception desk so that children can be added to the register. Some specialist lessons for our R3 and FS1 students, such as PE and Music, begin straight away so we encourage you to be punctual so that your child does not feel rushed.





### HOME TIME

At home time, your child should be collected from the classroom. If you wish another parent, friend or relative to pick up your child, please inform your child's class teacher as early as possible. You can verbally inform the teacher. telephone the school throughout the day or provide a letter or email. We will not allow your child to be picked up by anyone else unless we have been previously informed of this arrangement. If you have a driver or a helper at home that will be picking your child up please bring them in and introduce to staff members at the beginning of the year to ensure our staff will release your child to that adult.

### LATE ARRIVALS:

Students are required to arrive on time for school. If arriving late, parents must report to Reception. Students will not be able to access classes without first being registered at Reception.

### **ABSENCES AND SICKNESS**

If a student is absent, please phone the Reception team on: **04 361 9361** or SMS **3559** before 8.00am and the reason will be recorded. Alternatively please email your child's Class Teacher and copy in the nurses: nurseclinic@dubaibritishschool.ae.

If your child is unwell, please keep your child at home until they are fit to attend school.

Children must be fever-free and free from diarrhoea for a full 24 hours before returning to school after illness. After 3 consecutive days of absence, a doctor's note will need to be provided.

### EMERGENCY LEAVE OR DOCTOR APPOINTMENTS:

### WELCOME FROM THE MEDICAL TEAM

Dear Parents,

We would like to extend a very warm welcome to all students and their parents. We are looking forward to working with you and your children here at Dubai British School Emirates Hills. To ensure your child's health and safety we would like to share a few points with you.

We shall be present at all times during the school day to administer first aid as required. Children who are taken ill at school will be cared for by us until they are fit enough to return to class or a parent/guardian can be contacted and arrangements made for them to be collected and taken home.

Please also be aware that children are not allowed to go home via taxi unless escorted by a parent/guardian. The expected pick up time is 15-20 minutes.

If your child has a persistent condition, allergy or medical condition that the school should be aware of, please specify in detail the nature of the condition, the signs and symptoms and any medication that may need to be administered.

If you have not completed the school's medical form, please ensure that this is completed and returned, along with a copy of all childhood vaccinations, prior to schools commencement.

If you have any further queries, please do not hesitate to contact us. We look forward to a safe and healthy school year. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

# School Life at DBSEH

### **CLASS ALLOCATION**

Due to the need to balance class sizes, genders and children's needs (and potential last minute withdrawals) we will allocate your child to a class in late August and will communicate this information to you when inviting you to the 'Meet the Teacher' appointment. Your child's class teacher will communicate the days of swimming (FS1), PE, and library lessons. Tuition fees for Term 1 must be paid in full in order to be placed on a class list. The deadline for this is 1st August.

### **CUBBIES**

R3 and FS children each have an open cubby where they can place their lunch and snack bags, book bag and change of clothes during the day.

### **EQUIPMENT NEEDED**

- Snack box and lunch box that your child can open (labelled). These should be packed in a small bag or backpack that can fit inside the cubby.
- DBS Book Bag (labelled)
- Water Bottle (labelled). Students can refill their water bottles during the

**Hat** – Magrudy's stock the school hat or the children may bring an easily identifiable hat from home. Please label this clearly.

Spare clothes - Please send in underpants, shorts, socks and a t-shirt in a small plastic bag with your child's name on each item. This is used for toilet accidents wet/messy or play. The children do not require any other school bag or back pack. They will use their book bag for craft work, library books or notes that need to be taken home. The children need to have as little as possible in their cubby holes each day to make it them easy for to manage their belongings.

### LIBRARY LESSON

The children will have a library lesson once a week. They will be allowed to borrow one book each week which they can change weekly, providing that they return the previous book. The library is also open to parents after school. Please feel free to visit and borrow additional books from the library.

### LUNCH AND SNACK BOXES

The children have a separate snack and lunch break. Some children want to eat everything at the first break time so it is very helpful if you can send in one box for snack and another for their lunch.

Please ensure that the containers are easy for the children to open and close and that all items, e.g. cutlery, inside the boxes are named. We do not provide cutlery at school so, if your child needs a spoon or fork to eat their snack/lunch, please put one in their lunch box. You may like to send in a carton of juice for lunch but this should be in addition to a water bottle.

We have a healthy eating policy, therefore please do not include chocolate, crisps, sweets or fizzy drinks as part of your child's packed lunch or snacks.

We have students in school with fatal nut and sesame seed allergies. Nut and sesame seed products such as Nutella and hummus must not be included in packed lunches. We are also a pork free school.

### **SECURITY - ID PASSES**

All guests entering the school must have a valid Parent, Carer or Nanny ID pass. Please ensure you are always visibly displaying your ID in the lanyard around your neck. Without a Parent, Carer or nanny pass, visitors will be asked to provide an alternate form of ID by the security team at the gate before being allowed on to the campus.

To receive a Parent or Carer ID pass, please email a recent passport photo for each parent or carer to reception@dubaibritishschool.ae stating the parent's and student's full name and year group, or hand the passport photos into Reception. To request an ID pass for a nanny, please collect the application form from Reception or request the form via email from reception@dubaibritishschool.ae.



# School Life at DBSEH

### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

In Rising 3 and Foundation, children will have two PE lessons each week. In FS1, one of these will be a swimming lesson. On their PE day they should come to school dressed in their PE Kit rather than the regular school uniform (please keep this in mind when considering quantities of uniform to purchase). On their swimming day they will wear their PE Kit to school with their swimming kit underneath. They will get changed in class in preparation for their swimming lesson.

For swimming the children will need a swimming bag containing:

- Swimsuit (DBS swimwear)
- Hooded Towel
- Flip flops/ Crocs
- Underwear
- Swimming Cap
- Goggles

Note: Rising 3 children will not have swimming lessons at school.





### **CRECHE FACILITY/ AFTER SCHOOL CARE**

DBS Emirates Hills **does not provide a crèche facility**, but ISM Sports offer after school care for FS children with siblings in the Primary School.

ISM Sports After School Sibling Club is held on the school premises. It runs Monday to Thursday. There is no club on Fridays or any days when school is not in session. Places will be limited in order to maintain a staffing ratio of 12:1 with two staff members present. To register, contact services@ismsports.org or +971 58 565 1808. Please note there is a fee for this service.

### **HOUSE SYSTEM:**

The DBSEH house system is divided into four houses (Falcons, Scorpions, Vipers and Wildcats) and provides a sense of shared identity and community between our students in different classes and year groups.

The school's reward system builds upon the house system allowing students, from Year 1 onwards, to earn house points which have value both for themselves and for their house. Although students in Foundation Stage do not make full use of their House Identity until Year 1, it still provides a sense of family and collegiality between older and younger students.

As students move through the school they are open to take part in regular house events, which could be academic (reading, spelling bees, writing competitions), sporting (athletics, swimming galas, cross country), extra curricular (bake-offs, designing, musical performances) and allow each student to be recognised and celebrated for their unique interests, skills and talents.
