INCLUSION SUPPORT

Our vision 'Enjoy, Aspire, Achieve' applies to every student who attends DBS Emirates Hills.

Since our establishment, we have prided ourselves on being an inclusive school supporting a diverse range of pupil needs. We are proud to have a strong inclusion team of Teachers and Learning Assistants, with a wide range of expertise, skills and qualifications to ensure that every student's needs can be identified swiftly and supported appropriately.

Early intervention is a key factor in determining student success. This, alongside strong parent partnerships, are essential components of our support strategy. Therefore, If you have a concern regarding your child's learning please do speak to your child's teacher in the first instance. Our staff will be able to best advise you on how to take your concern forward. Equally if our staff have any concerns about your child they will raise them directly with you before proceeding with any intervention.

Where students do need an additional layer of support, we ensure that parents' queries and concerns about their child's development are discussed openly and thoroughly before putting a support plan in place. Once these conversations have happened together, the school and parents collaborate to devise a personalised educational plan for their child, which meets both the child's academic and pastoral needs.

The nature and level of the support we offer depends on the needs of your child and can be short or long term, individual or group, within the classroom or outside of the classroom. We tailor support for every child differently. Rigorous monitoring procedures around every intervention ensure that however we are supporting your child, we know that it is making an impact. Additionally, the traditional curriculum is not always suited to all. Consequently we can also offer bespoke curriculum pathways to meet every student's needs.

If more specialised intervention is required we liaise closely with outside agencies including educational psychologists, occupational therapists and speech therapists. These agencies work in partnership with both the teachers and parents, offering advice and guidance on adaptations that may be required.

We are committed to nurturing every pupil and empower successful, well rounded individuals, equipping them with the skills essential for life-long learning.

LATE ARRIVALS

Students are required to arrive on time for school. If arriving late, parents must report to Reception. Students will not be able to access classes without first visiting Reception and collecting a 'Late' slip.

ABSENCES AND SICKNESS

If a student is absent, please phone the Reception team on: **04 361 9361** before 8.00am and the reason will be recorded. Alternatively please email your child's Class Teacher and copy in the nurses: nurseclinic@dubaibritishschool.ae and Reception: reception@dubaibritishschool.ae.

If your child is seriously unwell, please keep your child at home until they are fit to attend school.

Children must be fever-free and free from diarrhoea for a full 24 hours before returning to school after illness. After 3 consecutive days of absence, a doctor's note will need to be provided.

First Day Arrangements

Secondary students may enter via the main gate or either fishbowl from 7:30am onwards and go to their class. If students opt to ride their bike to school, they can park their bike outside in the secondary bike racks.

ART

Students in Years 7 are expected to purchase a sketchbook which they will use until the end of Year 9. If students in Year 8 and Year 9 have lost their sketchbook or have run out of pages, they are expected to buy a replacement sketchbook.

The purchased sketchbook must be **A4, spiral bound** and hardback. Sketchbooks can be found in stores such as Boarders, Creative Minds or Dryad General Supplies in Al Quoz.

- Scissors




MATHS

In Secondary, students must bring the required maths tools:

- Protractor

- A personal calculator

We recommend the Casio FX 991EX, as this calculator is suitable from Year 7 through to Year 13. There are other less advanced calculators in the Casio FX range that will be suitable from Year 7 through Year 11, be sure to look for those which say *natural* above the screen.

Bring Your Own Device

DBS Emirates Hills has a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program for Year 4-13 students. BYOD refers to where students bring a personally-owned and school-approved device to school.

By bringing their own device, students will learn how to use technology to support themselves; utilising specific tools to support their learning style, as well as knowledge-based apps which they can rely on to secure key learning facts.

Teachers also share banks of resources via the devices for students to be able to revisit and revise as little or often as they would like. Further up the school, students will utilise word-processing skills to prepare them for the realities of 21st century communication beyond the school walls.

The school can provide the ability to connect compatible devices to a filtered and secure internet service, with stringent firewalls and security measures to protect all of our students. From the youngest years in Primary, students are taught specific skills in online safety and the BYOD scheme provides opportunities for students to independently apply these skills in a safe environment.

STUDENT DEVICES IN SECONDARY SCHOOL

While we do not have strict device requirements in secondary school, we do offer the following guidance to support your child's learning:

- **Years 7 & 8**: Students may use a tablet, particularly if they already own one from Year 6, although a laptop is preferred. However, we recommend that any tablet be paired with a physical keyboard to support typing and productivity.
- **Year 9 and Beyond**: As students progress to Year 9, we encourage a transition to a laptop to better meet their academic needs. Although we do not mandate a specific model or brand, please note that the majority of our digital tools and platforms are Microsoft-based.

Beyond these recommendations, no additional specifications are required. Should you have any questions about device compatibility or support, please don't hesitate to contact us.

SECURITY ID PASSES


All guests entering the school must also have a valid ID pass. These are different if you are a Parent, Carer, Driver or Nanny. Please ensure the pass is always carried and visibly displayed. Visitors will be asked to provide photo ID by the security team at the gate before being allowed on to the campus.

DBSEH is a 'mobile-phone free' school for students up to and including Year 11.



All of these roles are designed to ensure that students have explicit opportunities to develop leadership and responsibility, but equally they benefit the school as a whole. New opportunities for student leadership often become available throughout the year, however all roles are rotated annually, allowing a variety of children to take on leadership opportunities year on year.

HOUSE CAPTAIN / VICE HOUSE CAPTAIN:

One of the ways we develop leadership and responsibility at DBSEH is through our House Captains and Vice House Captain system. Annually pupils are invited to apply for the roles and it is always a popular process. House Captains and Vice House Captains are assigned to each house from each year group at DBSEH. Their role includes helping to organise, promote and motivate their house team members to compete in the various competitions throughout the year in an effort to win the House Cup.





STUDENT AGENCY:

In many ways every pastoral aspect mentioned in this section encourages the development of student agency - the ability for young people to be involved in decisions affecting them. DBSEH is committed to ensuring that all its students meaningfully express their perspectives and opinions. We consider students as partners in their own development and by providing children with broad opportunities develop their voice. We aim to ensure our students are fully equipped with the life skills needed for success in the 21st century.

Enrichment & Support

SCHOOL COUNCIL:

This is run by the Heads of the School Council who are appointed from the prefect body. Two students from each form are elected to represent their year in the School Council. The School Council has many responsibilities, however ultimately they are required to help develop the school and continue to improve the environment for the students.

School Counsellors

Hello!

We are the counselling team here at DBSEH and we are looking forward to welcoming you and your children to our wonderful community. We meet with all new students to introduce ourselves and let them know where to find us if they need support.

Our role as School Counsellors is to work with students, parents, teachers and outside agencies to support the social and emotional development of students. This involves providing confidential individual and group counselling in the areas of personal, social and emotional needs. During counselling sessions we help students with issues such as problem solving, emotional difficulties. general coping strategies, setting achieving goals, developing self-esteem, peer relationships and social skills.

Some common challenges that bring students and families to counselling are:

Change (transitions)

- Transfer to or from a different school
- Family separation, changing roles or relocation
- Reallocation of teachers

·Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Grief and loss
- Trauma and crisis intervention
- Social relationships
- Cultural and ethnic differences

Family issues

- Challenging behaviours at school and home
- Family discord
- Financial pressures

Schooling issues

- Special Educational Needs
- Academic or exam related stress
- Attendance

In Secondary School, referrals can be made by parents, through the pastoral team or by students themselves, who can self-refer. It is our protocol at Dubai British School to work in partnership with parents wherever possible. However, as per our Counselling Policy, secondary students can consent to counselling if they are of sufficient understanding and intelligence to understand the process. Children and Young People have the right to refuse or discontinue counselling at any time as they will only benefit from the support if they want to be involved.

We also organise 'Let's Talk' coffee mornings for parents and would love to hear from you if you have specific requests for topics you would like to see covered. We are available to meet with parents (by appointment) to discuss any social/emotional concerns.

Career Guidance in Secondary

Provision of Careers Education, Information and Guidance (CEIAG) continues to expand at DBS; now COVID restrictions have eased, and students over the age of 15 are legally allowed to work part-time in the UAE, students will he afforded greater opportunities to engage with the workplace, higher education and employers than ever before.

Our primary resource in school remains the CEIAG platform, Unifrog (www.unifrog.org) that all students and parents from Year 9 upwards has access to

Students from Year 8 upwards carry out CEIAG activities appropriate to their age; most of these activities are delivered as part of the PSHE programme, some delivered at specific times in the school year when they relate to key transition points.

Senior students receive bespoke advice and guidance relating to their subject choices at and beyond DBSEH,

as well as a number of sessions that develop students' professional, academic and domestic skills in preparation for life after DBSFH.

Mr Barfoot's role as Head of University and Career Guidance is to equip students with the skills to use information about their next steps effectively.

HOUSE SYSTEM:

The DBSEH house system is divided into four houses (Falcon, Scorpion, Viper and Wildcat) and provides a sense of shared identity and community between our students in different classes and year groups.

The school's reward system builds upon the house system allowing students, from Year 1 onwards, to earn house points which have value both for themselves and for their house. Although students in Foundation Stage do not make full use of their House Identity until Year 1, it still provides a sense of family and collegiality between older and younger students.

As students move through the school they are open to take part in regular house events, which could be academic (reading, spelling bees, writing competitions); sporting (athletics, swimming galas, cross country), extra curricular (bake-offs, designing, musical performances) and allow each student to be recognised and celebrated for their unique interests, skills and talents.



PE \$ Sport

Sport at DBSEH is exciting, fun and engaging, to be felt throughout the school, bringing both physical and mental wellbeing to our students and staff. There is always happy competition and inclusion throughout the year groups to provide something for everyone.

Being part of a team holds important values of respect, motivating and compassion, that transcend beyond the playing fields.

Our facilities include an outdoor, fully shaded, temperature-controlled pool. It is host to swimming lessons throughout the school and a number of exciting competitions. Primary and Secondary Swim squads train multiple times during the week, in the morning and afternoons. Try-outs are at the start of each term, organized by the PE Department.

Swimming Galas between the DBSEH Houses as well as inter-school Galas are all held here. This is a fun, exciting and very noisy part of the school.



The multi-purpose sports-hall is used by all students as part of their varied PE programme. Curriculum activities include gymnastics, ball games, volleyball, badminton and basketball. Our netball, volleyball and basketball teams and recreational squads also use the facility regularly for training and hosting interschool sports fixtures.

Our sports field is one of the busiest facilities. The students love the space that this provides for their lessons and after school activities. The fully enclosed astroturf hosts an array of sports fixture and our teams enjoy the DBS home crowd support on these occasions. We follow the DASSA Sporting Calendar and try-outs for rounders, cricket, athletics, football and rugby teams will be held at the start of respective seasons.








Extra-Curricular Provision
