

A Level and BTEC study habits

- In Year 12 students will have 6 lessons per week in each subject
- A Levels are a big step up from GCSEs
- Students are expected to complete significant amounts of independent study
- To achieve their potential, student should spend a similar amount of time studying out of class as in class. From the start of Year 12!

Advice to Year 11 families ...looking beyond the sixth form

University

- Benefits of independent living, immersion in a subject you love.
- Access to graduate jobs.
- Potential for further study: MSc, PhD, career in academia.
- BTEC/A-level choices may be important depending on which country you want to study in & degree course you wish to study (more on this in the next slide).

Or something else?

- Gap year (make it useful)
- Apprenticeship (can include a degree e.g. PWC)
- Employment
- Enlisting in uniformed services*



A VERY brief review of pros/cons of studying in...

UK:

- Established education system.
- Straightforward application process.
- Portable degrees.
- Ability to work whilst studying.*
- Easy entry with DBS qualifications.*
- Fee Status*

US:

- Established education system.
- Flexible degrees
- 'Open' admission requirements BUT can be complex process.
- Relatively expensive application process.

CANADA:

- Established education system.
- Ability to work whilst studying AND potential for visa/passport.
- 'Open' admission requirements.

MAINLAND EUROPE:

- Many courses taught in English
- Cheaper fees than UK, US, CAN.
- Check entry criteria carefully.*

AUSTRALIA:

- Established education system.
- Portable degrees.
- Not amenable to BTEC may require foundation year.
- Apply with results.

GERMANY:

- Free tuition possible.*
- Ability to work and gain passport.*
- German language requirement.
- A-level choices prescriptive.*
- BTEC not recognised.



UAE:

- Many campuses of long-established universities now opening.
- Potentially lower cost than studying abroad.
- Option to study abroad in yr 2/3/4.
- Pay careful attention to local entry requirements.*

A Level and BTEC courses

- Students choose 3 A Level or BTEC subjects from a choice of 24
- Students must meet entry criteria for A Level courses including:
 - A minimum of six Grade 5s or above at (I)GCSE to study any A Level(s)
 - A minimum of five Grade 6s or above at (I)GCSE to study three A Levels
 - Taking 4 A Levels is only suitable if your average GCSE grade is 8.0 or more
 - See Options Booklet for details
- Exploring the possibility of offering A Level Sociology from August 2026
 - If this is something you would choose, please return the form as soon as you can
- Year 12 assessments strongly influence University Predicted Grades
- The End of Year 12 Exams are the main determinant of University Predicted Grades

A Level and BTEC blocks

- Choose preferences freely on the form, free of any block structure
- The blocks will be built to accommodate as many first-choice preferences as possible
- Example of a block structure is below, but will change based on demand
- Final blocks will be built after 5th Dec based on preferences in forms received
- Most students will choose 3 subjects, maximum of one from each block

Key Stage 5 Options milestones

- October & November Careers guidance activities including Unifrog support
- Wednesday 5th November Options Evening (parents and students)
- Rest of November Students arrange to speak with staff
- Friday 7th November Options Booklet, Options Form & ppt emailed to parents
- Wednesday 19th November A Level and BTEC Subject taster Day
- Thursday 20th November Year 11 Data Report published
- Friday 5th December Options Forms due
- By mid-January 2026 Blocks finalised and any issues notified
- After Mock Results Course suitability conversations with students

- How is this subject assessed?
- What kinds of things will I learn about?
- What are the links between this subject and future careers and university options?

Do:

- Consider what you find interesting and are passionate about
- Consider the range of skills you wish to develop




Next steps for students...

- 1. Use the Taster Day to get a feel for potential subjects
- 2. Review the Options Booklet carefully to check all information about a subject including entry criteria
- 3. Speak with teachers, your parents and guardians, and the Sixth Form leaders
- 4. Research future career pathways & discuss with Mr Barfoot as required
- 5. Carefully review your report data and focus on your strengths
- 6. Decide what's right for **you**, the student
- 7. Submit your choices through the form shared via email as soon as you have decided and no later than Friday 5th December
- 8. Course suitability discussions with leaders will happen after the January Mocks
